The year began with our very own "International Day of Peace" on September 20th. Out of a bed of inspiring "Peace Rocks" grew our beautiful and vibrant "Helping Hands Tree", reminding our community to reach out, connect, and spread peace!

"Start With Hello Week" focused on our campus community and tied into our Day of Peace. The week centered on a simple, yet powerful concept. According to Student Government President Emma Hall, "Everyone on this campus deserves to be greeted and welcomed in a friendly way, each and every day. Just by greeting each other with a sincere smile and a simple "hello", provides an opportunity for the students of San Carlos School to make a significant difference to their peers in an easy, fun, and impactful way. We can take small but powerful actions to promote connectedness and inclusion and to find ways to make certain that every single member of our community feels

accepted, welcomed, and supported." The week was highlighted by a Middle School "Getting To Know You" Scavenger Hunt, a lovely "Chain of Unity, Peace, and Understanding" created by students and teachers, and a huge "Unity Circle" formed at morning assembly.

In November, we joined forces with Cross Catholic Outreach to support their worldwide "Box of Joy" effort. Organized by the 6th Grade Class, the SCS community spread the love of God at Christmas to needy children in Guatemala, Haiti, and the Dominican Republic through the power of simple gifts, like toys and school supplies.

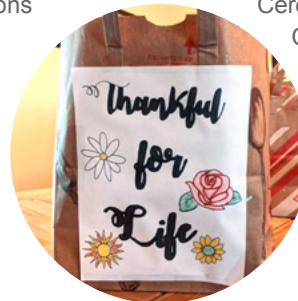
community of budding scholars who thrive because we set high expectations in a very nurturing, safe, and family-friendly environment.

## The Impact of COVID-19



The pandemic has severely impacted our daily financial operations since the Shelter in Place Order on 3/18. We're not only faced with the challenges of Distance Learning and the incremental costs associated with upgrading to Zoom Premium, but also the closure of Extended Care and our Branches Resale Shoppe, two significant sources of annual income. Our Time and Talent effort which helps us keep our tuition affordable is on hold until the start of the 2020 - 2021 school year.

We are preparing to purchase new required campus safety equipment for next year, including touch-free thermometers for every classroom, touch-free hand sanitizer dispensers for every room, and portable hand washing stations for the playgrounds and athletic field. We are also planning to purchase additional Chromebooks so students will not share devices.

We ask that you keep us in your prayers and consider making a year-end gift to our

# TEACHERS' TURN

## Distance Learning is Happening!

San Carlos School teachers and staff successfully transitioned from On Site to Distance Learning beginning on March 31st as part of the local effort to keep our SCS community safe and curb the spread of COVID-19.

As soon as it became clear that students would be unable to return to campus, teachers and staff jumped into action, giving up much of their spring break to learn Zoom's online meeting platform, plan for online lessons, and create learning schedules to accommodate the many different home situations of students. In addition, a Chromebook loan program was quickly implemented to support the Distance Learning technology needs of all students.

**Mrs. Bennett** made a key decision early on to survey all families for their input and use the information to create schedules for each class level that include time for online instruction and offline independent work. To help families with multiple students who need to be online at the same time, schedules were staggered and instructional segments were recorded and available for later viewing.

Lower School teachers utilized classroom website pages while Middle School faculty integrated Google Classroom to provide instructions, recorded videos, and printable work as



options for children who cannot be online for the live streaming of classes. Students and teachers became creative problem solvers as new technologies and routines had to be embraced quickly.

Although full-day schedules were planned, some courses were designated optional. Survey results indicated that full-day schedules may be too much for some families given their particular circumstances.

Core subjects of Reading, Math, Religion, Science, and Social Studies were required to continue to prepare students academically, but daily Art, Music, Lower School Technology, and PE were also incorporated into all schedules from TK to 8th Grade! These "Specialty" classes continued to support our students' health in Mind, Body, and Spirit...even in the most difficult times.

SCS is also continuing to maintain and reinforce its school connections through fun weekly family challenges such as "Share Your Dinner" with pics, "SCS Fam Jam", and virtual "Talent" and "Pet Shows".
